Community Member Utilizes SPMC Wellness Trail in Weight Loss Journey

It is clear when talking to Henry Dawson that he is a man on a mission. He is the owner of Elma Lanes, a professional bowler and employees of SPMC have come to know him as "blue coat guy." Henry walks the wellness trail at Summit Pacific every day for at least an hour. He walks more than three miles each day and as time went on, employees noticed a change in him. Henry has lost the equivalent of more than two bowling balls worth of weight, 40 pounds!

The trail, paved in 2015 after Summit Pacific Medical Foundation raised more than \$30,000 to fund it at their annual Celebrity Golf Tournament has been a great tool in Dawson's weight loss journey. The trail is one third of a mile in length and circles the SPMC campus.

"As I'm approaching my 60's I realize that I really need to get in better shape," said Dawson. He had given up bowling for nearly 20 years and noticed a drastic change about five years ago when he started bowling again. "I had to take breaks while bowling; I had

never had to do that before," says Dawson, "I would just get tired. That's when I knew I had to make some changes"

Elma Lanes is directly across the street from SPMC. Being just three minutes away from work is very helpful for Dawson, "If my staff need me, I can be there to help them in three minutes or less. Walking has also been a great way to relieve stress I have found." In addition to walking, Dawson has also removed soda from his diet.

He has noticed a drastic change in his bowling since losing nearly 40 pounds and is looking forward to competing in an upcoming bowling tournament in Reno, Nevada. I still have a ways to go but between the weight loss and giving up soda I realized that I have much more energy now," says Dawson, "Can you imagine living life carrying around two bowling balls everywhere you go?"

Henry Dawson purchased Elma Lanes 31 years ago in 1985. He supports the community in several ways including sponsoring Grays Harbor Raceway and the Special Olympics as well as offering a free bowling program in the summer for youth.



Ingredients

Summit Pacific Virtual Care Clinic Increases Public Access to Medical Care

Summit Pacific Virtual Care Clinic is available 24/7. The telemedicine service is available to conveniently treat individuals with non-emergency medical concerns.

Visits with a Virtual Care Clinic provider take place via phone or video through FaceTime or Skype on a computer or mobile devices with a camera. If a prescription is needed, the telemedicine provider sends the order to the patient's preferred pharmacy. Appointments cost \$40 and may be paid with a credit or debit card. Virtual Care Clinic users should contact their insurance to determine eligibility for reimbursement of the cost.

Healthcare providers treat non-life or limb threatening conditions treated through virtual care including cold and flu symptoms, headache, sore throat, pink eye, urinary tract infections, cold sores and rashes. Patients with more serious issues will be referred to Summit Pacific's Urgent Care Clinic or Emergency Department.

Most patients are seen within 10 minutes of their request for care and appointments conclude within 30 minutes. Medical records from the visits are shared with the patient's primary care provider. If the patient does not have a primary care provider, Summit Pacific Medical Center will help get them one.

"It's basically an urgent care clinic that you can visit electronically either virtually online or through an app on your mobile device," says Summit Pacific's CEO, Renee Jensen. "For conditions that need lower levels of intervention, they can get a quick prescription. For working families, the traditional health care hours are not conducive to coming in. I'm a busy working mom myself, so I know how challenging it can be."

Summit Pacific Virtual Care Clinic is available online through the SPMC website or through the SPMC Virtual Care app in the Apple App Store or Google Play.
